

THE HOLY FAMILY

If there is one phenomenon that characterizes the modern world, especially the West, it is the breakdown of family life. The most rampant divorce rate of human history, which in some cities in the United States has reached a rate approaching 100%. One large city recently reported they had five divorces for every one marriage that occurred. The national American rate is well over 50% and climbing constantly. Also, the breakdown of community religious life has contributed to the disintegration of hundreds of once-flourishing religious institutes in western society. One religious institute of women had a membership of 5,000 twenty years ago; today, they have 200 members left.

The breakdown of once cohesive parochial life, where parishes live together and work together as clusters of united families, is in many countries a fond memory. Yet, as the present Holy Father is never tired of repeating, the preservation of the family is necessary for the survival of society. Let us look to the Holy Family as the model for the modern world. **What are their qualities?**

- **First**, the members of the Holy Family were brought together by God Himself. It was He who brought Mary and Joseph together in marriage. It was the Holy Spirit who brought the Child Jesus into their company. The Holy Family was created by God.
- **Second**, in the Holy Family there was obvious diversity. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph were different persons with different temperaments and personalities.
- **Third**, in spite of their personal diversity, there was family unity. They not only lived together, prayed together, and worked together. They stayed together as a family.
- **Fourth**, their bond of unity was not their equality, because they were not equal. It was charity, genuine charity.
- **Fifth**, their charity was rooted in their united vision of a common purpose. They had one single goal—to work together as a community for the salvation of the human family.

How do we apply these five qualities to our own families? We find that each has much to teach us. Either we unite and rediscover these family virtues of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, or we shall further disintegrate as a society. Have no doubt, the devil and evil people, enemies of Christ and His Church, are united to the teeth.

The First quality is that all families are born of God. Every family comes into existence in order to be a reflection on earth of the Eternal Family, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. There was from all eternity a divine Holy Family of the three Persons. God as God is not solitary. God as God is a community. Families on earth are to be created manifestations of the uncreated Family, the triune everlasting God. No earthly family is just randomly brought together. Our fathers and mothers didn't just happen to meet one another and coincidentally happen to marry and have us as offspring. No! Every family—domestic, religious, parochial, or ecclesiastical—is the providential creation of God who is Himself the infinite community of the most Blessed Trinity.

The Second quality is that all members of a family are different; These differences are part of God's all-wise plan for His children. Each soul is individually, distinctively, and uniquely created by the Almighty God at the moment of our conception in our mother's womb. Variety in creation is a glorious reflection of the infinity of the all-perfect God. No one person could adequately manifest the ocean of attributes of the all-perfect God. God wants us to be different.


The Third quality is that the different members of a family should be united. Looking at the Holy Trinity, the Father is not the Son. The Father and the Son are not the Holy Spirit. Yet all form together the one God. So the members of every family should be united. A family ceases to be a family when each person pursues his own interests without concern for the other members.

The Fourth quality is the bond of love that unites a family. Only love can unite different, even disparate, people. Only love brings them together, keeps them together, and enables them to work together. Where this love is missing or weak, the family falls apart. Some years ago, I asked an Indian priest I know who had been in the U.S. teaching theology for four years, "Fr. Joseph, could you tell me what you found most inspiring and most depressing about the time you spent in the United States?" He replied, "The most inspiring thing was your liberty. The most depressing thing was your disunity." So I asked him, "What do you mean? Are the people in India more united than we are?" He said, "Yes, they are. Take family life. There are not just small villages, but good-sized towns in India where no one there can remember a single divorce taking place." Dear God, help save America, the land of liberty, which is becoming the land of disunity. We know that this bond of love means selfless love—sacrificing personal likes and dislikes for the sake of the family's good.

The Fifth quality is a Common Purpose. Only the common united vision of those who belong to a family gives them existence as a family and sustains them in family life. Where people lose a common vision, they lose their basis for a uniting love. For us Catholics, this common vision is born of faith. We must believe in one God, one Catholic Church, one vicar of Christ on earth, one destiny for the human race, one means of salvation! Then and only then shall we be united. What an examination of conscience we all have to make to ask ourselves this question: "How well am I contributing to the family into which God has placed me?"




Baptism Ministry

TO REGISTER, go to our website and click on Sacraments > Baptism. You will also need to bring a copy of your child's birth certificate to the class.

PARENTS & GODPARENTS are required to attend a class from 7:30 to 9:00 p.m., in the Parish Library (next will be January 4 and January 25). The fee is \$100 per child OR \$25 for the class only. Baptisms are on Saturdays (next open are at 11:00 a.m., on January 27 and February 10).

SELECTING THE GODPARENTS: Canon Law requires you to have at least one godparent (may have two) who: 1) is at least 16; 2) has been Confirmed; and 3) is a practicing Catholic. A form attesting to this needs to be signed by a priest from the parish of each prospective godparent.




