A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Blessed Advent, one and all! How are your preparations for the Coming of the Lord going as we enter this Second Week of Advent? Hopefully, amidst the pandemic struggles, your family and financial difficulties, and the challenges of shopping for loved ones, you and I are able to find some time for quiet prayer, listening for that reassuring, refreshing, encouraging Voice of the Lord Jesus speaking in the silent depths of our hearts. For some, that encounter happens at daily and/or Sunday Mass (or at our special weekly Candlelight Mass and Adoration on Thursdays starting at 7:00 p.m.) and, especially, after Holy Communion. One person shared how difficult the silence after Communion was at first, but that how—after some patient endurance and guidance (G-U-I-DANCE = God U I Dance)—that time has now become a regular source of peace and joy that overflows into the rest of the day. For others, perhaps it is praying a decade of the Rosary with the family after dinner, without any hurry, savoring the Scripture verses and the images surrounding that particular mystery, listening, waiting for the live Presence of the Holy Family to make Themselves felt. For still others, it might be working through the daily meditations and prayers to prepare for our parish-wide Total Consecration to Jesus through St. Joseph (see the newsletter link). Fomeone else, it might be slowly working through a book of Scripture like Isaiah ("the Fifth Gospel," as it is sometimes called), or the Gospel of Mark, or going deeper into the Mass Readings of each day.

Whatever way you might be praying, my hope is that Mary's special presence this week in the Solemnity of her Immaculate Conception (Monday, December 8) and in her Feast as Our Lady of Guadalupe (Saturday, December 12) will

fill you with new Light, Life, Love, and Joy!!! And please consider coming to our outdoor school fundraiser dinner on the 12th in the Guadalupe Garden with the Carmelite Friars and, possibly, also with Bishop O'Connell, if he can make it after he celebrates our 5:00 p.m. Mass that day!

As Covid cases keep rising and more people in our Parish are being affected, our Bishop has once again asked us to be strict about following the diocesan protocols for reducing the risk to others and ourselves. With that end in mind, my brother Carmelite priests and I are asking everyone to wear masks at Mass, keep six feet apart—especially in the Communion line—and to receive only in the hand. Bishop O'Connell and I and the other Carmelite priests know this is a hardship for many people. But I am confident that, as awesome sons and daughters of the Holy Family and of the Carmelite family, we will dig deep and follow the protocols—out of charity and obedience, sacrificing to reduce the risk for others. Let me finish by offering some more guidance on prayer—from the Gospels and from St. Thérèse:

Prayer is meant to be holy leisure, too, not always hard work; prayer after Holy Communion is especially meant to be a time of holy leisure, to able to able to climb into Jesus' lap and let Him fold His arms around us and hold us close. Here is a way of prayer to foster that kind of listening prayer. It is from the Bible and is called the Jesus Prayer: While breathing in, gently and silently say, "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God"; then, while breathing out, say, "have mercy on me, a sinner." This prayer is a combination of the prayer of the blind Bartimaeus calling out to Jesus (Mark 10:47), the prayer of the tax collector in the temple (Luke 18:13), and St. Peter's great statement of faith in Jesus (Matthew 16:16).

Once you get the hang of this prayer, you can shorten it to "Jesus" while inhaling and "mercy" while exhaling. With the help of St. Therese, you can also focus on other meanings of the word mercy besides that of a sinner pleading before the judge: "Therese has left on record how much she would have liked to learn Hebrew, so as to understand the Gospels better. And this no doubt would have been a great joy to her, for few Hebrew words are etymologically more rewarding than those used to convey the concept of 'mercy'. Four words are used to convey the reality: hanan: to lean over; hamalnoum: to suffer with, since one feels pity (like a judge looking at a repentant sinner); raham-rahamim: to be soft, like a mother's breast; and naham: to relieve someone, to stop his groans by helping him to breathe. What a program! Therese saw this as God's feelings with regard to man." (The Little Way, by Bernard Bro, O.P., p. 60).

So, you see? It is a very simple kind of prayer, biblical, rich in meaning, adaptable to whatever psychological, emotional, physical, or spiritual situation you find yourself in; and it gives your mind a little bit of food to meditate on while being simple enough so that you can listen to the live Person, Jesus, and try to listen to what He is saying to you. As you get used to this prayer, you can use it anywhere and anytime, focusing on that meaning of mercy which best fits what is happening in your life at that moment. You will find that you can easily spend 20 minutes with Jesus in this way, especially when He has just come into your very own house/body after Holy Communion.
