

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Greetings, everyone!

If today, July 25th, was not a Sunday, we would be celebrating the feast of St. James, the brother of St. John (Jesus nicknamed them the "Sons of Thunder"). St.James' Basilica in northern Spain is one of the most ancient pilgrimage sites in the Catholic Church: Santiago de Compostela. To walk even a little of the pilgrim route is an amazing experience. I hope and pray that you are able to go there someday and experience it for yourself!

Also today, we begin listening to the Sixth Chapter of the Gospel of St. John and will continue soaking in this key chapter on the Bread of Life, the Eucharist, for the next few Sundays. Today we hear the part about Jesus multiplying the bread and fish for the people. A similar miracle happened a few years ago when a group of parishioners crossed the border from the U.S. into Mexico to share food with their neighboring parish. They didn't bring enough food but somehow trusted that the Lord would provide; they were able to keep serving the food until everyone was fed! Everyone agreed that there was no way that they had enough food to feed all those people but, somehow, they were all still fed!!! Thank you, Jesus, for your ongoing signs and wonders that help us trust in your love for each one of us! -Fraternally, Fr Thomas, OCD

P.S.: Here are some more passages from *The Spiritual Gifts Handbook* about the working of the Holy Spirit in the early Church (pages 84-87). **Note:** Copies of this book are available for purchase in the office.

Interestingly, Cyprian includes among the gifts of the Spirit the reconciliation of enemies and the quelling of violence—gifts that are also being powerfully manifested in the world today. It is striking how often the early Christian bishops and other teachers sought to stir up in the catechumens a desire for supernatural gifts. The normal expectation was that when people were newly reborn in Christ, the Holy Spirit would impart these charisms to equip them for their mission as Christ's witnesses in the world. Tertullian (160-225), for example, exhorted the catechumens to pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit: "You blessed ones, for whom the grace of God is waiting, when you come up from the most sacred bath of the new birth, when you spread out your hands for the first time in your mother's house with your brethren, ask your Father, ask your Lord, for the special gift of His inheritance, the distributed charisms. 'Ask,' He says, 'and you shall receive.'"

The "bath of the new birth" is baptism, and "your mother's house" is the Christian community, the Church. The "spreading out of hands" refers to standing with arms raised and palms open, the customary posture for praising God in the ancient Church. St. Cyril (318-386 AD), bishop of Jerusalem, explained to catechumens how the Holy Spirit would pour out diverse gifts among them: "The Holy Spirit...distributes His grace to each, according to His will (1 Cor. 12:11), for He employs the tongue of one person for wisdom; the soul of another He enlightens by prophecy; to another He gives power to drive away devils; to another He gives ability to interpret the divine Scriptures." Cyril was not content merely to impart information about the gifts. He recognized the need to awaken expectant faith for the gifts, so he urged the catechumens: "Let each one prepare himself to receive the heavenly gift of prophecy. If you believe, you will not only receive forgiveness of sins, but also do things that surpass human power. ...My final words, beloved ones, are words of exhortation, urging all of you to prepare your souls for receiving the heavenly charisms."

Another bishop, St. Hilary of Poitiers (300-368 AD), explained that the gifts may be manifested in small ways at first, but they grow with use: "We who have been reborn through the Sacrament of Baptism experience intense joy when we feel within us the first stirrings of the Holy Spirit.


We begin to have insight into the mysteries of faith; we are able to prophesy and speak with wisdom. We become steadfast in hope and receive abundant gifts of healing. Demons are made subject to our authority. These gifts enter us as a gentle rain. Little by little, they bear abundant fruit."

One of the greatest theologians in history, St. Augustine of Hippo (354-430 AD), had assumed as a young bishop that miracles and other supernatural gifts had ceased after the age of the apostles. But Augustine was forced to change his mind when he witnessed so many remarkable healings. He even established the practice of recording these wonderful works of God to ensure that they would not be forgotten: "I realized how many miracles were occurring in our own day...and how wrong it would be to allow the memory of these miracles of divine power to perish among the people. ...It is only two years ago that the keeping of records was begun here in Hippo and, already at this writing, we have more than seventy attested miracles."

Augustine records the details of many of these miracles in his great work, *The City of God*. One that he witnessed personally involved a friend who was afflicted with horrible injury. The man had already undergone one operation but needed a second. Augustine wrote, "The man began to pray with

earnestness and emotion, and with a flood of tears, groans, and sobs that shook his whole body. His conduct diverted my attention and I could not pray at all. I briefly said in my heart: 'O Lord, what prayers of your people do you hear if you do not hear these?' The dreaded day dawned and the surgeons arrived. While those who had the most influence with the patient were cheering his fainting spirit, the knots of the bandages were untied and the part was bared; the surgeon examined it and, with knife in hand, eagerly looked for the sinus to be cut but found a perfectly firm cicatrix! No words of mine can describe the joy, and praise, and thanksgiving to the merciful and almighty God, which was poured from the lips of all with tears of gladness. Let the scene be imagined rather than described!"

It is noteworthy that this cure, like so many others, did not involve anyone known for a particular gift of healing, just a suffering person surrounded by his friends, all praying together fervently for the Lord to heal.





Quiet Listening Prayer

FROM ST. JOHN OF THE CROSS ASCENT OF MT CARMEL

A love of pleasure, and attachment to it, usually fires the will toward the enjoyment of things that give pleasure. A more intense enkindling of another. better love (love of the soul's Bridegroom) is necessary for the vanquishing



of the appetites and the denial of this pleasure.

By finding satisfaction and strength in this love, it will have the courage and constancy to readily deny all other appetites. The love of its Bridegroom is not the only requisite for conquering the strength of the sensitive appetites; an enkindling with urgent longings of love is also necessary. For the sensory appetites are moved and attracted toward sensory objects with such cravings that if the spiritual part of the soul is not fired with other, more urgent longings for spiritual things, the soul will be able neither to overcome the yoke of nature nor to enter the night of sense; nor will it have the courage to live in the darkness of all things by denying its appetites for them (Book I, Chapter 14, No. 2).
